Pastor's Ponderings

"And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that on the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless."
Philippians 1:9-10

This quote from Paul's letter to the Philippians encourages us to learn, grow, and act in love. It was three years ago, around Christmas when I (and the church), was given different knowledge. At the church Christmas Program, Sohail and Afreen Akhtar were cast as Mary and Joseph for the nativity scene. After the program, Sohail and I were discussing the program and he said, "Fred, I think this might be the first time the church has seen people playing Mary and Joseph, who might have looked like Jesus's parents." Wow, that is right—our Savior came from the Middle East and Southern Asia. Jesus probably had some similar characteristics to Sohail and Afreen. With this new "full insight," is our love flowing more for people who are different from us?

We seek and gain more knowledge at church to challenge and expand our world view. More knowledge to help us determine, as Paul says, "what is best" for us and God's world. If we continue following the birth narrative of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, we have Joseph, Mary and Jesus, fleeing to Egypt because Herod wants to kill him. Within the beginning three years of Jesus's life, he was a refugee and immigrant. This is more knowledge and insight to inform us so that our "love may overflow" as we welcome and treat refugees or immigrants fairly. Remembering our Lord was once running away from a fearful situation too.



We are called as Christians to look beyond human-made boundaries and to see people of the world of different races, ethnicities, and other distinguishing differences as our brothers and sisters.

Advent is the start of the new church year, and in this new year let us pledge to open ourselves to "knowledge and full insight" that would lead us to love and serve God's people to the best of our being.

Isaac Watt's Greatest Hits

Isaac wrote his first poem when, as a little boy, he saw a mouse climb up a rope. He laughed out loud when the family was praying, but his father forgave him because his poem said, "A mouse for want of better stairs, ran up a rope to say his prayers." He had his first song published when he was eighteen. He went on composing all his life, producing hundreds of songs in praise to God. There is beautiful poetry in many of his hymns.

"My body, broken for your sin, receive and eat as living food." He took the cup and blessed the wine: "Share this new testament, my blood."

"Before the hills in order stood or earth received its frame, from everlasting you are God, to endless years the same. A thousand ages in your sight are like an evening gone, short as the watch that ends the night before the rising sun."

"When I survey the wondrous cross on which the prince of glory died, my richest gain I count but loss and pour contempt on all my pride."

"Let every creature rise and bring honors peculiar to our King; angels descend with songs again, and earth repeat the loud Amen."

These are a few of his "greatest hits." *The Lutheran Book of Worship* includes twelve Isaac Watts' hymns, and *The Singing Church* has seven more. They speak as clearly to us as when he wrote them between the years 1692 and 1748. Yes, over 300 years ago! But every Christmas, we love to sing:



"Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let earth receive its King. Let every heart prepare Him room and heaven and nature sing, and heaven and nature sing, and heaven, and heaven, and nature sing."
