From the Pastor

"Arise, my love, my fair one,
and come away;
for now the winter is past,
the rain is over and gone.
The flowers appear on the earth;
the time of singing has come."

Song of Solomon 2:10-12

We are in the midst of winter (though we may break high temperature records). Ash Wednesday services reminded us that "we are dust and to dust we will return." The purple and black, paraments of Lent seem oppressive after the white of Epiphany. It still gets dark out **too** early. The cold is biting, and the driving can be somewhat unpredictable. It is the shortest month, yet it feels to me, the longest.

It seems to be a month for Eeyore, "days, weeks, months, who knows?" Yet during February, we are reminded of **Love** on the 14th. In that vein I am reminded of the romantic, amorous poem in the Bible, **Song of Solomon**, and the above quote that hangs on my wall. The flowers to me is promise. The singing describes hope. And as we know from Paul's letter to the Romans, hope does not disappoint.

It is a call for us to be active in "hope" activities. Both TOL and Augustana through their ministries instill this in fragile populations: TOL, to those families who struggle with dementia and at Augustana, to those who are far from their homelands searching for a new home. The declaration of **Hope** permeates these ministries and needs to overflow in our expression to the world.



Saddened by the gun violence seen at Parkland, Florida and in our city streets, exposed during domestic issues, and lethal at suicide attempts, we need to inform the world that **Peace** is the answer. **Love** is life giving. And Jesus' life, death, and resurrection advocated for these to be his message in a very violent time in history. So God's justice cries out for continued ministry to the "least of these" in our community; God's justice calls for disarmament and policy that would reduce the needless gun deaths in our society.

Flowers and singing are coming. Thanks be to God for sharing the "Good News" Jesus brings all people.
